End-of-Life Planning with Don Reeder

We plan for the big events in our lives—graduation, marriage, the birth of a child, a milestone birthday, a dream vacation. But most of us don't plan for the big event that *all* of us will eventually experience—the end of life. Don Reeder, a longtime West Side member and attorney in Waldwick, will tackle this topic on **September 15 at 11:30 am** in DePhillips Hall. This seminar for ALL AGES is designed to empower you to voice and document your individual end-of-life care

wishes. The conversation will continue, in partnership with The Valley Hospital, on **November 5 at 7:00 pm** in the Sanctuary with Jessica Zitter, M.D., a critical and palliative care specialist and author of *Extreme Measures: Finding a Better Path to the End of Life*.
